Greetings from the capital of Maryland, and home of the United States Naval Academy!



The biggest news is the hiring of Mr. Max G. Moses, JD, CPA, MBA, as AGD's new executive director.

An experienced executive, lawyer and CPA with a strong association management and dental industry background, Moses brings a broad range of skills to this role. I have been impressed with him so far and have confidence he will help the AGD achieve new heights including increased membership and increased attendance at the Annual Scientific Session.

The AGD House of Delegates Annual Governance Meeting was held in November in Chicago. It was a busy meeting with many things discussed in the House. 14 resolutions were discussed. Here are some highlights:

- One of the biggest discussions was on the budget resolution and the recommendation from the Budget and Finance Committee to raise student dues from \$17 to \$27, which would cover the cost of publications. After long debate a final decision was made to increase the student dues to only \$22. Additionally, regular membership dues will increase for the first time in two years by \$6 to \$392.
- Resolution 304 was passed, in response to the news report last year that flossing didn't prevent tooth

decay: "Resolved, that the AGD supports flossing as an integral part of oral hygiene care."

- The House passed the AGD policy statements: "AGD Policy Statement on the Consumption of Sugar and its Health Care Consequences" and "Off Label Use of Dental Products".
- The House adopted the AGD white paper: "White Paper on the Role of Dentistry in Addressing Opioid Crisis."
- And finally of note, the House passed "The Academy of General Dentistry (AGD) supports educating the dental profession and the public as to the value of dental screenings and HPV vaccination to help prevent Oral Cancer."
- All of the other resolutions were administrative in nature.
- Elections for the new AGD officers for 2018-19 were held. Well, there wasn't much of an election as all candidates ran unopposed. Congratulations to the following new officers of the AGD: Vice President Dr. Connie White; Secretary Dr. Michael Lew; Speaker of the House: Dr. Bryan Edgar; and Editor: Dr. Roger Winland.

Hopefully many of you have already registered for the AGD 2018 Scientific Session to be held in New Orleans from June 7-9. Army is coordinating the Region 17 social which will be held on Friday Jun 8. This is always a great time to connect with many friends and colleagues from across all the Federal Services.

I hope that 2018 proves to be a successful year for all of our AGD members in Region 17. I wish you all the best for the coming year. See you in New Orleans!

Greetings from Las Vegas! It's hard to believe that we are already well into 2018 and the Scientific Session is just around the corner! As I took account of the months that have already flown by, I realized that I was so consumed by the busy-ness in my daily routine that I neglected to tend to things like working out, shopping for groceries and gardening. For those of you who know me well, I'm sure you are chuckling to yourselves right now.



I figured that I could outsource groceries and yard work – though have yet to actually pull the trigger on those – but had to find a solution for fitness. My friend suggested that I

join her for a yoga class, so I decided to give it a try. Though I'm not quite convinced that yoga can take the place of "going to the gym," it seemed like a good adjunct for developing strength and flexibility. Though I'm just starting on my yoga journey, I immediately noticed a couple of things.

Royal Canadian Dental Corps Newsletter

Royal Canadian Dental Corps Message

The Canadian Forces Health Services Training Centre (CFHSTC) at Canadian Forces Base Borden is known as the Home Station of the Canadian Forces Health Services (CFHS) and the Royal Canadian Dental Corps (RCDC). Its mission is to train and educate Health Services (HS) personnel in

validated, evidence-based medical and dental protocols and doctrine, using innovative, cost-effective and pertinent training methodologies with a view to enable its graduates to support the Canadian Armed Forces mission anytime and anywhere. Every member (Officer and Non-Commissioned Member) of the RCDC spends time at the Training Centre (TC) starting with their respective foundational course focused on learning to work within our garrison dental clinics and on operations. These courses also help to socialize new members to military life. After gaining more experience in clinics, dental officers and dental technicians (assistants) return to the TC in order to receive more advanced training in preparation for leadership roles or, in the case of dental officers, to also upgrade their clinical knowledge and skills. The TC offers 4 hands-on clinical courses in the fields of oral surgery, endodontics, periodontics and prosthodontics.

Although the CFHSTC is steeped in military tradition, the need to evolve and modernize is nonetheless extremely important. While the basis of the courses themselves may not change, each course's content must constantly be updated to ensure HS personnel are being taught the most relevant and up-to-date information possible. Furthermore, running courses requires considerable resources in terms of personnel, time, and money. Therefore, the TC is constantly seeking ways to improve, not only its effectiveness, but also its efficiency. Many of the courses now include a distance learning (DL) component. This allows some or all of the didactic material to be taught in advance of the practical residential portion and spares considerable resources.

Recently, the Clinical Endodontics Course was taught at the TC with Maj Ashley Mark, Comprehensive Dentist (Ft Hood 2-year AEGD, 2012), serving as the Course Director. Maj Mark put in considerable hours to update the course content and to create an impressive DL module. This DL module used the TC's Learning Portal, was made accessible through the broader Defence Learning Network, available at any

Base/Station or from home. Students were required to logon to access course material, videos, and references, and to prepare for teleconferences with the course instructors to discuss the material and answer questions. These teleconferences served to ensure learning objectives were met while providing valuable insight with respect to which topics might require additional reinforcement.

In 2015, the RCDC acquired new Mobile Dental Clinics (MDCs) to be used on domestic and expeditionary operations. The MDCs serve as self-contained dental operatory and can be transported to any location via ship, aircraft, or on a vehicle platform. Once in location, the dental officer and dental technician are responsible for set-up, operation of the unit including trouble-shooting, maintenance, and tear-down. These competencies are taught during the foundational dental courses at the TC as well as through "just-in-time" pre-deployment training with required validation prior to deployment. Maj Rachel Jetté and Sgt Shannon Steinke recently embarked on a project that will allow this training to be delivered via DL. Serving as subject matter experts, they are working with e-learning developers to essentially convert the operating manual into an interesting and interactive e-course that dental personnel will be able to access from anywhere to learn or refresh their knowledge of the MDC. It provides students slides with instructional content, pictures, and interactive diagrams.

The CFHSTC now has its own embedded Learning Innovation Development Section (LIDS) under the command of the Unit Research and Development Officer. This team consists of civilian e-learning Instructional Designers who work with subject matter experts to create engaging, interactive e-courses. The TC believes these courses are capable of modernizing how students learn as we move away from traditional lectures and rote memorization to student-inquiry, independent thinking, problem solving and, ultimately, application of knowledge. It is anticipated that this type of training will eventually be incorporated into all CFHSTC courses with the goal of enhancing our ability to better achieve our mission in delivering health care to our soldiers, sailors and aviators.

It is very important that you contact AGD when your E-mail address changes and/or you move. This will ensure that you receive your AGD publications and *The Federalist* newsletter in a timely fashion. Prompt notification also saves Region 17 and National AGD the cost of additional mailings.

You can make changes with AGD in one of several ways. Lake St., 6th Floor, Chicago, IL 60661-6600**. Be sure to include your member number and specify the Federal Service to which you belong. This will help prevent AGD from transferring you from your Federal Service constituent to the constituent of the state to which you are moving. It is **not** necessary to send changes to Region 17.
